GETTING AROUND THE VALLEY WITHOUT A CAR

Need to get somewhere in the Snoqualmie Valley, but don't have a vehicle or don't want to drive? It can be done!

Driving a car is just one option Valley residents can use to go shopping, get to medical appointments, pick up the kids after school, take part in your favorite activities and entertainment, and even get to work.

There are also several public transportation services, operated by Snoqualmie Valley Transportation (SVT), King County Metro, Hopelink and Sound Generations/Hyde Shuttles, available to all riders, regardless of age, income or disability.

SNOQUALMIE VALLEY TRANSPORTATION

SVT is your local bus company, launched in 2003 as a project of Mt. Si Senior Center.

SVT provides three types of service in the Valley and **all are accessible and available to the general public.** Well-behaved pets also allowed!

Demand Response is a call-in-advance, shared-ride service providing door-to-door service for \$1 per ride.

The **Valley Shuttle** is a fixed-route service operating M-F on a regular schedule, stopping at the Metro bus stops in the valley along Hwy 202/203 from North Bend to Duvall. Fares are a \$1 suggested donation per ride.

This bus can depart from normal routing in North Bend or Duvall upon request.

Circulator or **Loop Routes** offer convenient, "hop on, hop-off" fixed-route service within the Valley; no need to call in advance. Loop routes stop at designated locations on a regular schedule. Loop Routes can go off route to pick up or drop off people with disabilities. Call in advance to arrange this service at no additional cost. "**Little cities, little buses; SVT does rural right.**"

COMMUNITY SHUTTLE

Community Shuttle service is part of King County Metro Transit's Community Connections program. Route 628 in the Snoqualmie Valley takes riders from North Bend to the Issaquah Highlands Park & Ride, and back. During peak commute times, the shuttle runs every 30 minutes.

Community Shuttle is a fixed-route service that can depart from normal routing in the Issaquah Highlands area only, upon request. Call to request off-route trips. Vans may stop at locations a block or more from your starting point or destination.

METRO TRANSIT

King County Metro Transit provides fixed route bus service and public commuter vans throughout King County. Routes in the Valley include: 224 - Duvall to Redmond Transit Center; 232 - Duvall to Redmond Transit Center to Overlake Transit Center to Bellevue Transit Center; 208 - North Bend to Issaquah Transit Center. Getting to a Transit Center connects you to other routes to major cities.

All Metro buses have lifts or ramps or users of wheelchairs and scooters and others who use a walker or cane or simply have trouble climbing steps. You will need to get on and off the bus at an accessible bus stop.

The Duvall Community Van is a shared-ride service. Volunteer drivers offer pre-planned local trips for a standard Metro fare. You may go online to request trips, join a ride, or to learn about becoming a volunteer driver on the website. Accessible trips are available upon request.
