



SVT Celebrates Successful Turnout at 2026 Snoqualmie Street Fair

September 12th, 2026: Snoqualmie Valley Transportation (SVT) is celebrating a successful showing at the 2026 Snoqualmie Street Fair, held Saturday, September 12, on Center Boulevard SE in Snoqualmie Ridge. SVT staffed a booth at the free, family-friendly event, connecting with valley residents and visitors throughout the day.

Hosted annually by the City of Snoqualmie, in partnership with the SnoValley Chamber of Commerce, the Street Fair ran from 11:00am to 4:00pm and drew a strong community turnout for an afternoon of global flavors, live music and cultural dance performances and hands-on activities for all ages.



Families, Snoqualmie residents and newcomers to the valley filled Center Boulevard, browsing booths, enjoying performances, and taking part in all the festivities. This year's Fair brought together a wide array of local artisans and food vendors from across the Snoqualmie Valley, offering handmade crafts, candles, henna tattooing, and international cuisine alongside traditional dance and music performances. SVT's booth fit naturally into this lineup of local businesses and community organizations, giving visitors a chance to learn about the door-to-door and fixed-route bus service that connects North Bend, Snoqualmie, Fall City, Preston, Carnation, Duvall, and Monroe. Many visitors

had seen previous marketing from SVT about the new Metro 215 route connecting the valley to light rail and were happy to get the new timetables. Some were excited to introduce their children to the buses by planning a family field trip on the Valley Shuttle to visit the farms. Others were surprised at the coverage offered seven days a week in our rural region and were looking forward to using the SVT routes to add to their ability to reach trails on their bikes.

664 visitors stopped by the SVT booth throughout the day to ask about routes, schedules, and how to get to popular valley destinations. For many visitors, the event offered a first introduction to SVT's affordable and accessible transportation options.
